

CHARTER COUNTIES WITH COUNTY MANAGERS

ALACHUA COUNTY

ARTICLE II. ORGANIZATION OF COUNTY GOVERNMENT

Sec. 2.1. Elected commission and appointed county manager form of government.

Alachua County shall operate under an elected county commission and appointed county manager form of government with separation of legislative and executive functions in accordance with the provisions of this home rule charter. The legislative responsibilities and powers of the county shall be assigned to, and vested in, the board of county commissioners. The executive responsibilities and power of the county shall be assigned to and vested in the county manager, who shall carry out the directives and policies of the board of county commissioners and enforce all orders, resolutions, ordinances, and regulations of the board, the county charter, and all applicable general law, to assure that they are faithfully executed.

BREVARD

SECTION 1.5. DIVISION OF POWERS

This Charter hereby establishes the separation between legislative and executive functions of Brevard County government. The establishment and adoption of policy shall be the responsibility of the Board of County Commissioners and the execution of that policy shall be the responsibility of the County Manager.

CLAY

ARTICLE II.

ORGANIZATION OF COUNTY GOVERNMENT

Section 2.1: Elected Commission and Appointed County Manager Form of Government.

Clay County shall operate under an appointed County Manager form of government with separation of legislative and executive functions in accordance with the provisions of this Home Rule Charter. The executive responsibilities and power of the County shall be assigned to and vested in the County Manager, who shall carry out the directives and policies of the Board of County Commissioners and enforce all orders, resolutions, ordinances, and regulations of the Board of County Commissioners, the County Charter, and all applicable general law, to assure that they are faithfully executed.

COLUMBIA

1.6 Division of powers

This Charter hereby establishes the separation between legislative and administrative functions of this government. The establishment and adoption of policy shall be the responsibility of the Board of County Commissioners and the execution of that policy shall be the responsibility of the County Manager.

LEE COUNTY

ARTICLE II

ORGANIZATION OF COUNTY GOVERNMENT

Section 2.1: Elected Commission and Appointed County Manager Form of Government

Lee County shall operate under an appointed County Manager form of government with cooperation of legislative and executive functions in accordance with the provisions of this Home Rule Charter. The legislative responsibilities and powers of the County shall be assigned to, and vested in, the Board of County Commissioners. The executive responsibilities and power of the County shall be assigned to and vested in the County Manager, who shall carry out the directives and policies of the Board of County Commissioners and enforce all orders, resolutions, ordinances, and regulations of the Board of County Commissioners, the County Charter, and all applicable general law, to ensure that they are faithfully executed.

MIAMI-DADE **COUNTY MANAGER**

SECTION 4.01. FUNCTIONS.

The Manager shall serve under the direction of the Mayor and, as directed by the Mayor, shall assist the Mayor in the administration of County government. The Manager's compensation shall be set by the Mayor.

Article II: Organization of County Government

Organization of County Government

SECTION 2.1 Elected Commission and Appointed County Manager Form of Government.

Osceola County shall operate under an elected County Commission and appointed County Manager form of government with separation of legislative and executive functions in accordance with the provisions of this Home Rule Charter. The legislative responsibilities and powers of the County shall be assigned to and vested in the Board of County Commissioners. The executive responsibilities and powers of the County shall be assigned to and vested in the County Manager, who shall carry out the directives and policies of the Board of County Commissioners and enforce all orders, resolutions, ordinances, and regulations of the Board, the County Charter, and all applicable general laws, to assure that they are faithfully executed.

POLK

ARTICLE 3

Administrative Branch: County Manager

3.1 County Manager: qualifications

There shall be a County Manager who shall be appointed by the Board of County Commissioners and who shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of County Commissioners. The County Manager shall be chosen on the basis of his or her professional training, executive and administrative experience and qualifications. The manager shall maintain residency within the county during the tenure of office and shall not engage in any other business or occupation without the express approval of the Board of County Commissioners.

SEMINOLE

ARTICLE II. ORGANIZATION OF COUNTY GOVERNMENT

Section 2.1. Elected Commission and Appointed County Manager Form of Government.

Seminole County shall operate under an elected County Commission and appointed County Manager form of government with separation of legislative and executive functions in accordance with the provisions of this Home Rule Charter. The legislative responsibilities and powers of the County shall be assigned to, and vested in, the Board of County Commissioners. The executive responsibilities and power of the County shall be assigned to and vested in the County Manager, who shall carry out the directives and policies of the Board of County Commissioners and enforce all orders, resolutions, ordinances, and regulations of the Board, the County Charter, and all applicable general law, to assure that they are faithfully executed. Prosecution and defense of legal causes in behalf of the County and legal services to the Board of County Commissioners and administrative staff shall be the responsibility of the Office of County Attorney.

VOLUSIA

Section 203. Division of Powers. This charter hereby establishes the separation between legislative and administrative functions of this government. The establishment and adoption of policy shall be the responsibility of the council and the execution of that policy shall be the responsibility of the county manager.

WAKULLA

1.6 Separation of powers

Wakulla County shall operate under an elected county commission and appointed county manager form of government with separation between the legislative and executive functions of the government in accordance with the provisions of this Charter. The establishment and adoption of policy shall be the responsibility of the Board of County Commissioners and the execution of that policy shall be the responsibility of the county manager, hereinafter referred to as the County Administrator.
