Home Rule Charter History

Prior to January 1979, there were three attempts to adopt a home rule charter for Hillsborough County. These were in 1967, 1970, and 1972. The constitutional officers largely opposed the proposals because they wanted to be excluded from any reorganization under a consolidated City-County Charter.

A fifteen member charter study panel was appointed in January 1979. The purpose of the panel was to conduct a comprehensive study of the operation of county government and suggest ways that it might be improved.

Panel Members: Thomas Evans, Chairman, Joseph Bondi, Vice Chairman, Ann Callahan, Albert Davis, Debra Ann Garcia, Noreen Follman, William Frye, Joseph McFarland, Jr., William McMullen, Howard Moore, Mark Straley, James Toopes, Jr., and Henry E. Williams, Jr.

This group met for approximately one year and made the following recommendations for the Board of County Commissioners to approve for a Charter.

1. Expansion of the BOCC from 5 to 7 members.
2. Creation of an elected county executive with veto powers over the BOCC.
3. Creation of independent board to serve the Hospital Authority and the Environmental Protection Commission
4. Establish an authority to create a separate Civil Service Authority.

The Charter was rejected by the Board of County Commissioners in May 1980, due to the issue of countywide districts vs. single member districts. Charter was send back to the County Attorney's Office for rewrites.

BOCC asked for the Charter to be sent back to them from the County Attorney's Office after the receipt of the Attorney General Opinion and report that the Constitutional Officers could be excluded from a home rule charter. This was in March of 1981.

A fifth draft of the Charter was introduced by the BOCC in July 1982 and featured the following:

1. Appointment of a county administrator
2. Five member Board with commissioners who must reside in the district that they represent and all would be elected countywide.

3. Recall provision, recall could be initiated and accomplished by citizens. (The Florida Constitution had no provision for removal of County Commissioners by voters)

The simple charter plan passes in August 1982 with a 3 – 1 vote. Commissioner Davin questioned the authority of the County Attorney to revise the Charter without explicit guidance from the Board of County Commissioners. She was also concerned because Commissioner Platt was absent from this meeting.

Public hearings in September 1982 were not favorable for the new proposed charter and the public opposed it as drafted. This Charter did not go to the election ballot in November 1982.

Due to the lack of consensus by the Board of County Commissioners concerning the Home Rule Charter, State Senator Betty Castor indicated to the BOCC that the Legislative Delegation may take steps to initiate major changes to the county government structure. Ms. Castor and other members of the Legislative Delegation felt that the BOCC had failed to act over the past eighteen months to move to home rule.

Armed with the 1981 Attorney General's Opinion and other legal documents the way was cleared in Tallahassee for the Delegation to propose a charter or to appoint a charter commission to propose a charter.

January 1983 the Delegation and the BOCC met in a workshop and agree to appoint a task force to go forward with creating a charter.

Three Hillsborough County Commissioners were suspended from Office in February 1983. The Charter issue is postponed until the Governor appoints replacements. Commissioners voted later to request that the joint task force be comprised of five commissioners and five legislators to draft the Charter for the County.

Two Charter Drafts go to the Legislative Delegation. The draft by Rep. Helen Gordon Davis, Rep. Marry Figg, and Senator Betty Castor included:

- a. Enlarge BOCC from 5 to 7; five would be single member, two elected at large
- b. Have an appointed County Administrator
- c. Reduce BOCC Salaries from \$33,000 to \$15,000 per year

Attorney William Frye filed the second draft and it included:

- a. Increase the number of commissioners to 7 and elect all countywide

b. Create an elected county executive

The Hillsborough County Legislative Delegation decided to use a bill filed by Representatives Helen Gordon Davis, Mary Figg and Senator Betty Castor. It also would create a task force that would include legislators and commissioners to write a preliminary draft of a charter to be presented to the delegation prior to session.

Also under consideration was the passage of a home rule charter through a local bill after receiving input from the City of Tampa, Temple Terrace and Plant City.

In April of 1983, the Task Force sends it version of the Charter to the Legislative Delegation, a bill is drafted, and the new charter is returned to the County Commission. The reasons it was sent back to the Commission are as follows:

1. Lack of BOCC support
2. No local editorial support
3. Legislative time constraints

The Hillsborough County Commission agrees to reconsider the charter proposals with the goal of placing the issue on a ballot in September 1983. This begins the compromise and work begins to debate and shape the new charter.

In June 1983, the BOCC works to find a middle ground and the new proposal states;

1. No person belonging to one branch may exercise any power appertaining to the other branch.
2. An appointed county administrator hired by a super majority vote and fired by a regular majority vote. (Five or Seven)
3. Expansion of County Commission from five to seven. Four commissioners elected from single member districts and three elected county wide.
4. Staggered terms for BOCC to achieve continuity in county policy and direction.
5. Reduction of BOCC salaries from \$33,000 to \$24,000 per year.
6. Special provision for local planning agency, The Hillsborough County-City Planning Commission
7. No change to Constitutional Offices.
8. County Attorney hired and fired by County Administrator, subject to confirmation by the BOCC.
9. Provisions for recall and initiative to amend charter
10. Charter Review Board to be appointed by the BOCC two years after the Charter takes effect for a one year period and every five years thereafter.

Public hearings held in July 1983, favorable input and by ordinance the BOCC voted to call for a special election in September 1983 to place the Charter on the Ballot. The Special Elections was scheduled for September 20, 1983.

The home rule charter was approved and the new Charter would go into effect two weeks after the November 1984 general election. Because the Charter provided for a major change in the elected officials who would govern the County--from five county commissioners elected at-large to seven commissioners, with four to be elected from single-member districts and three to be elected countywide--the County was required to submit the plan to the U.S. Attorney General for preclearance under the Voting Rights Act.

Implementation of the Charter, set for November 1984, was delayed when the U. S. Attorney General officially lodged objections shortly before a scheduled primary election. Additionally, plaintiffs in a then-pending lawsuit against the County and City of Tampa in federal district court sought to enjoin the election of county commissioners because the "4-3 plan" of four single-member districts and three at-large districts had not received preclearance. The district court granted the injunction and prohibited the election of county commissioners. However, the County asked the Attorney General to reconsider his objections to the Charter's election plan.

Upon reconsideration of the Charter and its 4-3 election plan, the Attorney General withdrew his objections. The district court subsequently withdrew its bar to the election of commissioners, clearing the way for elections to be held. The first commissioners elected under the Charter took office and Charter government went into effect on May 28, 1985.

On September 4, 1985 first Charter Review Board was appointed by the Hillsborough County Commission and their first meeting was held on Tuesday, October 1st. This Board held its final meeting on September 3, 1986.

Proposed amendments included an elected executive (mayor), term limits, residency requirement, salary, veto power, a professional administrator appointed by the elected executive, qualifications, defining powers of executive and administrative branches, seven single member County Commission districts, Charter Review Board appointments, meeting dates, and an amendment outlining political activities. Charter amendment proposals went to public hearing on June 30, 1986 and July 14, 1986. Both of these meetings were held at 5:30 p.m.

Following public hearings and legal counsel's review of technical and Charter Review Board members proposed amendments a motion was made on July 21, 1986 to adopt the proposed charter. Ten votes are required by the Charter to place amendments on

the ballot, this motion failed by a vote of 7 YES and 7 NO and there was nothing send to ballot.

Total budget requested was \$ 90, 312.00 (\$50,000 for legal counsel to the Board, Research Support Services \$ 14,000, and full time staff position \$26,312). Total meetings held were 24 and this included 18 regular, 2 public hearings, 3 drafting committee.

The second Charter Review Board was appointed in 1990 and held its final meeting on February 4, 1991. This board voted to send a number of amendments to the voters by a 10 – 4 vote for the November 1992 general election.

Proposed amendments to the charter were as follows: A separation of the powers into a legislative and executive branch, vesting the legislative power in a Board of County Commissioners and the executive power in a county chairman and a county administrator. Providing for the powers, duties, selection, qualifications, tenure and compensation of the Commissioners, County Chairman, and County Administrator.

Providing for the organization of the Executive Branch, limits on political activities; An administrative Code and a provision for municipal ordinances were in conflict with county ordinances, municipal ordinances would prevail. Providing for a County Attorney and for legal services, a provision for amendments to the Charter and a Charter Review Board initiatives, providing for limitations on State Law; providing for ethics and enforcement of ethics, defining conflicts of interest, providing for severability, providing for vacancies, providing for recall, providing for planning and environmental agencies; prohibiting discrimination; providing for transition and schedule; and preserving rights and obligations.

Meetings were held in the School Board Auditorium and the three public hearings were held at the County Court House, Board of County Commission Room – 214F. Total Budget Requested: \$ 75,000. (Mr. Lawson was Outside Counsel and billed at the rate of \$150 per hour, Mr. Shepherd was the Executive Director and billed at the rate of \$15.00 per hour. Telephone, document preparation, printing, and postage was billed “in-county” against board budget. Miscellaneous expenses incurred were for newspaper subscriptions, advertisements, office supplies, out of town travel and telephone). Budget was amended again after the Board completed its task to allow Mr. Lawson to go to Washington for Justice Department Review.

The ballot language was challenged in Court and thrown out as it was too confusing to voters. The amendments appeared on the ballot however, the votes were not counted . Total meetings held were 45 -- 33 regular, 3 public hearings, 9 sub-committee meetings.

The third Charter Review Board convened in February 1995 and completed its term on January 23, 1996. This Charter Review Board was the first to hold some of its meetings outside of County Center. Meetings were held in Temple Terrace, Plant City, East Bay High School in the South County area, and Gaither High School in Northwest Hillsborough.

Summary of Proposed Charter Amendments debated upon included: An elected administrator, an elected Chairman similar to that of Orange County, an elected Board of County Commission Chairman, an elected internal auditor, broadening of the administrator's qualifications and Charter Review Board meeting frequency. The only proposal to get the required votes by the Charter Review Board to go to ballot was the Charter Review Board meeting schedule. This proposal would amend the Charter to provide that the BOCC to appoint a Charter Review Board every eight years instead of every five years. Any amendments proposed by the Charter Review Board appear on presidential election ballots in eight year cycles, and that the next CRB be appointed

February 1, 2003, and thereafter every February 1 of every eighth year which precedes a presidential election year...providing for an effective date.

The authorized budget for this Charter Review Board was \$100,000. The Charter Review Board requested that only \$38,869 be allocated until it was determined if outside counsel was needed. Outside counsel was not hired, the County Attorney's Office served as Counsel to the Board.

Mr. Marshall Smith was hired as the Executive Director at the rate of \$25.00 per hour and worked approximately 20 hours per week. He left shortly before the board completed its work and Judith Nichols from the Clerk's office assisted the Chairman to complete the necessary reports. The Board's total expenses were approximately \$25,000. Total meetings held were twenty four – 22 regular meetings and 2 public hearings. The amendment was defeated by the electorate on November 5, 1996.

The Fourth Charter Review Board was appointed by the Board of County Commission at the December 1, 1999 meeting of the BOCC. The Board of County Commissioners named 13 members and Commissioner Scott would have his other selection named as soon as possible. The Board of County Commissioners received some resignations and on February 2, 2000 all CRB members were confirmed with exception of Danny Wilkes which followed on February 10, 2000.

Appointed members of the 2000 Charter Review Board met for their first meeting on February 9, 2000. The members present at the first meeting were; Mike Bedke, John Bales, Kevin Ambler, Denise Lasher, Henry Beltran, Gerald White, Dee Williams, Danny Wilkes, Steve LaBour, Jan T. Smith, David, Hurley, Arlene Waldron, MaryLou Tuttle, and Terry Ballard.

This Board debated many issues and by a majority vote voted to send the a proposal to amend the Charter to include an auditor/budget analyst to report to the Board of County Commissioners. This will go to the voters in the November 2002 elections.

The Budget allotted to the CRB was \$50,000. The Board finished its deliberations and we came in under the \$50,000. The County Attorney’s Office represented the CRB and Conflict Counsel was chosen and Ms. Marsha Rydberg agreed to serve and her rate of pay would be at \$175.00 per hour. The CRB did not use conflict counsel for any issue. Barbara Meritt was hired as the Executive Director at the rate of \$25.00 per hour. Initially, the contract was for 20 hours but it was amended as the work load increased. Ms. Merritt did all office functions, typing, filing, phones, research and agenda packet preparations. Hours varied from 24 – 32 per week. Total of 24 meetings held, 4 public hearings and 3 sub-committee meetings. (Approximately 102 hours.) This was the first Board with a website and during meetings gave the viewers an opportunity to call in for public input.
