Titanic Volunteers Needed

When "Titanic: The Artifact Exhibit" runs at MOSI from Oct. 4 through Spring 2004, approximately 400 volunteers are needed to staff and support the exhibit. The exhibit includes re-creations of the mammoth luxury liner's interior, displaying the famous grand staircase and first- and third-class cabins. It also features actual artifacts from RMS Titanic recovered from the wreckage.
